

 Represents youth in IARU R1 Coordinates youth activities in the region Is behind the YOTA – Youngsters On The Air





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


SUMMER CAMPS

- An annual, one week long, YOTA Summer Camp organized by IARU member societies
- Up to 30 national teams of youngsters
- Workshops, presentations and projects covering lots of ham radio aspects

SUBREGIONAL CAMPS

- Younger stations as higher multipliers
- Aim is to increase the youths' activity on the air



1st round: 22nd April, 0800 - 1959 UTC

2nd round: 22nd July, 1000 - 2159 UTC

3rd round: 30th December, 1200 – 2359 UTC
